

Alan LeBaron is professor of Latin American history, with a specialty in Mexico, Central America, Brazil, and World History. He was president of the Southeast World History Association from 1996 to 1999, and served on the Executive Council of the World History Association. He was president of the Georgia Association of Historians in 2006. He has directed the nationally recognized Maya Heritage Community Project since 2002, and he recently completed a 5-year award-winning grant project with the Governor's Office of Highway Safety. Currently he is co-editing a national research book on Maya Immigrants in the USA, working with among other groups the National Museum of the American Indian in Washington D.C. Since the early 1990s, he has organized local and national panels, workshops, and conferences on Maya migration. In 2006, he published an edited work: *MAYA PASTORAL: NATIONAL CONFERENCES AND ESSAYS ON THE MAYA IMMIGRANTS*. Dr. LeBaron was awarded the Kennesaw State University Distinguished Service Award for 2005, in recognition of his work in bringing an international focus to our university.
